## 2010 CYCLE Award Nominees

### INDIVIDUAL

- [ ] Mike Fann – donation of earthwork in preparation of Transportation Enhancement grant for Peavine Trail nonmotorized overpass; funded Prescott’s skate/BMX park
- [ ] Tom Pettit – long-term Board member of PAT; long-term President of Open Space Alliance (which was key to coordinating the Greenways Trails Committee); long-time bike commuter
- [ ] Jan Alfano – long-time President of Yavapai Trails Association, this region’s strongest advocates for nonmotorized trails
- [ ] Rob Hehlen – long-time active member of Prescott Cycling Club; avid mt. bike advocate actively involved with the newly formed Prescott Mountain Bike Alliance (PMBA); spent hours creating presentation to Council on the benefits of grade-separated Peavine crossings

### BUSINESS

- [ ] New Belgium Brewing – years of financial support to PAT, plus donations of beer and other items (incl. cruiser bike for fundraising raffle this year); support to PMBA; reputation for being a ‘bike-friendly’ employer and encouraging people to ‘trade their car for a bike’
- [ ] The Raven Café – always willing to host events (ie, Ales for Trails and Bike Month Movie Nights); often donate prizes for raffles or other needs; large number of employees bike to work; in process of acquiring large bike rack
- [ ] Prescott Coffee Roasters – donate coffee to trail volunteers and for Ride to Work with the Mayor; willing to host gatherings (ie, Bike Month coffee mornings); large number of employees bike to work

### GOVERNMENT

- [ ] Eric Smith (Parks & Rec/Trails) – instrumental in securing grants to begin implementation (and expansion) of Greenways Trails; also worked on grants for initial phases of Peavine; now working hard to submit grant for Peavine overpasses; also currently working with ADOT on future multi-use pathway parallel to SR69 connecting to Prescott Valley
- [ ] Sgt. Tim Fletcher (Police Dept.) – partner in the SRTS program offering safety escorts and instruction during Walk to School day events, Bike Rodeos; member of Transportation Coordinating Committee (and of former Prescott Bicycle Advisory Committee) always willing to respond to bike/car collision questions, etc.
- [ ] Cat Moody (GIS specialist) – supplies Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant application with maps admired (and now emulated!) around the state; long-time member of former PBAC; willing to include cyclist barriers on streets along with pothole reporting via the City’s website

### NON-GOVERNMENTAL

- [ ] Miller Valley Elementary – during its second year as a partner school within the SRTS program, established an afterschool bike club, hosted a bike rodeo, produced Prescott’s 2<sup>nd</sup> alternative transportation-themed mural (with all the challenges that entailed!); at least two of its teachers are regular walking/biking commuters
- [ ] Yavapai Trails Association – this region’s strongest advocate for nonmotorized trails; instrumental in furthering the argument for grade-separated Peavine crossings
- [ ] The Mural Mice – for not just beautifully representing alternative transportation on two school walls as part of the SRTS program, but also being regular bike commuters: during the painting of the Mile High mural they borrowed our bike trailer so they could haul all their supplies back and forth via bicycle!
